Raglan Sweater

Featuring Patterned Panel

MATERIALS

18 (19) (21) (22) ozs. Kaiapoi Glen Mist Double Knitting Crepe.
Two No. 8 and two No. 10 knitting needles; four No. 10 needles with points both ends; one cable needle.

MEASUREMENTS

To fit: 32 (34) (36) (38) inch bust.
Length: 22 (22½) (23) (23½) inches.
Sleeve: 17½ inches.

TENSION

5½ stitches to 1 inch over stocking stitch on No. 8 needles.

ABBREVIATIONS

Beg., beginning; **cont.**, continue; **dec.**, decrease; **fol.**, following; **ins.**, inches; **inc.**, increase; **k.**, knit; **p.**, purl; **patt.**, pattern; **rep.**, repeat; **rem.**, remain; **reqd.**, required; **sts.**, stitches; **st.st.**, stocking stitch; **tog.**, together.

Tw.2F., k. into front of second st. on left needle then into front of first st., slip both off tog.

Tw.2B., k. into back of second st. on left hand needle then into front of first st., slip both off together.

C.4F., slip next 2 sts. on to cable needle, leave at front of work, k.2, then k.2 off cable needle.

C.4B., slip next 2 sts. on to cable needle, leave at back of work, k.2, then k.2 off cable needle.

C.6B., slip next 4 sts. on to cable needle, leave at back of work, k.2, then k.4 off cable needle.

C.6F., slip next 2 sts. on to cable needle, leave at front of work, k.4, then k.2 off cable needle.

Tbl., through back loop.

BACK

With No. 10 needles cast on 103 (109) (115) (121) sts.

1st row: K.1, (p.1, k.1) to end.

2nd row: P.1, (k.1, p.1) to end.

Rep. these 2 rows for 1½ ins. fin. with 1st row.

Change to No. 8 needles and beg. with a p. row cont. in st.st. until work measures 15 ins. from beg. or length reqd. fin. with a p. row.

ARMHOLES

Cast off 6 sts. at beg. of next 2 rows. 91 (97) (103) (109) sts.

****Next row:** K.1, Tw.2F, k.2 tog., k. until last 5 sts., k.2 tog., tbl., Tw.2B, k.1.

Next row: K.1, p. to last st., k.1. **

Rep. last 2 rows until 33 (35) (37) (39) sts. rem. Leave sts. on holder.

FRONT

With No. 10 needles cast on 101 (107) (113) (119) sts. and work in rib as for back for $1\frac{1}{2}$ ins. fin. with 1st row. Inc. 3 sts. evenly along last row. 104 (110) (116) (122) sts. Change to No. 8 needles.

1st row: K.37 (40) (43) (46) sts., p.1, k.4, p.2, k.6, Tw.2F, Tw.2B, k.6, p.2, k.4, p.1, k. to end.

2nd row (and alternate rows): P.37 (40) (43) (46) sts. k.1, p.4, k.2, p.16, k.2, p.4, k.1, p. to end.

3rd row: K.37 (40) (43) (46) sts. p.1, C.4B, p.2, k.6, Tw.2F, Tw.2B, k.6, p.2, C.4F, p.1, k. to end.

5th row: K.37 (40) (43) (46) sts., p.1, k.4, p.2, C.6B, Tw.2F, Tw.2B, C.6F, p.2, k.4, p.1, k. to end.

7th row: As row 3.

9th row: As row 1.

11th row: As row 3.

Rep. until work measures the same as back to armholes.

ARMHOLES

Keeping patt. correct throughout, cast off 6 sts. at beg. of next 2 rows, 92 (98) (104) (110) sts. Rep. from ** to ** on back until 42 (46) (50) (54) sts. rem.

Next row: K.1, Tw.2F, k.2 tog., k.8 (10) (12) (14) turn. Keeping raglan shaping correct, dec. 1 st. at neck edge on next and every foll. row until all sts. have been worked off. Slip next 16 sts. on to holder and complete the other side to match.

SLEEVES

With No. 10 needles, cast on 45 (47) (49) (51) sts. and work in rib as on back for $1\frac{1}{2}$ ins. fin. with a 2nd row.

Change to No. 8 needles and beg. with a k. row, cont. in st.st. inc. 1 st. at each end of 7th and foll. 6th row until there are 75 (79) (83) (87) sts. Then cont. straight until sleeve seam measures $17\frac{1}{2}$ ins. from beg. or length reqd., fin. with a p. row. Mark this point then work a further 8 rows straight. (These 8 rows are set into armhole shaping and are not included in sleeve seam measurement.)

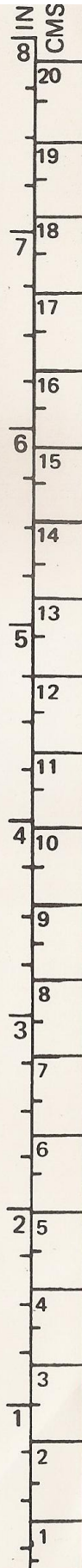
Shape top: Rep. from ** to ** on back until 17 sts. remain. Leave sts. on holder.

NECKBAND

Join raglan seams. With 4 No. 10 needles and right side facing, work in k.1, p.1 rib across all sts. on holders, picking up and ribbing 7 (9) (11) (13) from each side of front and knitting 2 tog. at centre front neck, 96 (102) (108) (114). Cont. in rounds of k.1, p.1 rib for $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. Cast off loosely in rib.

TO MAKE UP

Press work with a hot iron over a damp cloth. Sew last piece of sleeve seam to cast off sts. at armholes. Join side and sleeve seams. Fold neckband in half to inside and slip st. Press seams.



KNITTING HINTS

Always knit from the outside of the wool, as knitting from the inside reverses the twist and can cause a light reflection that appears as a shading. When purchasing wool always check to ensure that the **same** batch number is featured on all the balls.

Mixed Batches

Never leave a row of knitting partly completed, ensure you finish the row as this will show when next knitted.

When knitting has been left on the needle for a period of time it is advisable to undo the row prior to commencing knitting, this eliminates a line caused.

By using one needle sizing smaller on the purl row, uneven knitters will eliminate the ridged look on alternate rows.

To avoid a loop at buttonhole edge, when pattern states cast on 3 sts. over the cast off 3 sts. of previous row, cast on 4 sts. and on the next row work two together at button hole edge.

When knitting for tinies place buttonholes on both bands and cover buttonholes not required by sewing buttons on over buttonholes. As this child outgrows the garment so it can be handed down for either boy or girl—simply cut off buttons and sew to other side.

To cover buttons: Using double knitting weight cast on 9 sts. on No. 10 needles; for 4 ply weight cast on 12 sts. on No. 12 needles, and knit a continuous strip in stocking stitch. Place buttons on strip and allow sufficient either side of button to cover. Mark off required amount by sticking cellotape to knitted fabric, cut through cellotape and knitting. The cellotape holds the cut stitches and allows for you to pull firmly and neatly to the underside of the clipmould button.
